What is expected of NATHO members?



The National Association of Travel Healthcare Organizations is a non-profit association established to promote ethical business practices in the travel healthcare industry. All members of NATHO must meet the gold standard of conduct.



WHAT IS REQUIRED OF NATHO MEMBERS?

- Current Joint Commission Certification is required. The certification programs are designed to evaluate clinical programs and their practices ensuring commitment to quality and compliance.
- Each NATHO firm must be able to provide proof of insurance. This includes, but is not limited to, Professional Liability, General Liability, and Workers Compensation.

HOW ARE NATHO MEMBERS HELD ACCOUNTABLE?

- If a NATHO member's ethical decisions are questioned, a formal complaint must be submitted to the NATHO Ethics Committee. The committee reviews the complaint and makes a decision from there regarding further discussion with that member and/or membership suspension.
